Recently our research-oriented crew headed to Las Vegas for the PGA West trade show to look for stuff that you golfers want, review the courses and report back with some Vegas travel tips. [TIP A: Jet Blue is a fantastic way to travel - big seats with leg room and TVs] On the first night after a big hassle getting into the room, we played at the pyramid shaped hotel/casino for a while but neither Bogeyman nor Lefty were impressed. [TIP B: Avoid the Luxor] The following day we ventured out to Royal Links to play in the PGA Show tournament. We were treated to a fine golf course, demoed some neat products and enjoyed the Vegas hospitality. On our return trip Lefty, Bogeyman and the laughing Frenchman made an unplanned stop at Sam's Town Resort and Casino. This "off strip" joint did not offer all the glamour and glitz of the big casinos but the quiet ambiance, not-so-crowded gaming, and prompt drink girls made for a nice evening. So nice, we ended up spending most the night there. Constellation Energy Senior Players Championship Rolls Into Town

From October 1st thru 7th Baltimore Country Club gets a BIG TIME event as Bobby Wadkins defends his title close to his own back yard. Living in Richmond, Virginia Bobby Wadkins knows Baltimore Country Club is going to be set up tough so he has made a few trips to play BCC and prepared to defend his title. Wadkins is excited about defending his title close to home. The Senior Players Championship event is celebrating its 25th Anniversary in 2007. Champions Tour professionals who have committed to the event include defending champion Bobby Wadkins, World Golf Hall of Fame members Ben Crenshaw, Hale Irwin, Tom Kite, Bernhard Langer, Nick Price and Tom Watson, Maryland native and fan favorite Fred Funk, Gil Morgan, Craig Stadler, Jeff Sluman, Jay Haas, Scott Hoch, Denis Watson, Jim Thorpe and Chip Beck. The list of past champions of the tournament includes Arnold Palmer, Chi Chi Rodriguez, Gary Player, Jack Nicklaus, Hale Irwin, Raymond Floyd, Craig Stadler and Peter Jacobsen. Beginning this year, the event will be played on the East Course at Baltimore Country Club in Timonium, MD, with a field of 78 Champions Tour players competing for a share of the \$2.6 million purse, the largest of the season.

Brad Foxwell and Jim Winner turned the final round of the 18th BMGC Fall Publinx Championship into a record-smashing affair at Forest Park Golf Course. Foxwell posted scores of 75-65 for a total of 140 while Winner came up one shot short with scores of 75-66 for a total of 141. First it was Foxwell, shooting a 5 under par 31 on the front nine to set up a victorious round of 65 and a two-day total of 140. Then it was Winner, not under par until the 15th hole, surging down the stretch with a birdie-eagle-birdie-birdie finish for a back nine 6 under 29 and a tally of 141. In the process, the two, who had opened with 75's at Mount Pleasant GC, used these heroics to vault over six competitors. It's a Scramble, Not a Best Ball...

As the height of the 'second season' for charity golf outings kicks into high gear, it never ceases to amaze this Waggle at the number of people who do not know the difference between a scramble and a best ball format. So to clear things up here's a quick primer... a scramble (captain's choice, superball, or Lauderdale) is where each member of the team tees off and then their next shots are all hit from the position chosen by the captain, presumably from the spot where the best drive came to rest. Team members continue this format until their ball is holed. Best ball means that each team member plays their own ball on each hole and records the best individual score as the team score. Sure there are a zillion wrinkles to both these formats and as someone who plays 3 outings a week, I've seen a half zillion. But, please remember that a scramble format is not the same as best ball. **-Ayce**
